Psalms - Finding our own New Song!

The concept of a "new song" is presented strongly in the Psalms (33:3; 40:3; 96:1; 98:1; 144:9; 149:1). - great study! It also occurs in Isaiah 42:10; Revelation 5:9; and 14:3. - great study as well!

The word *new* means to "renew" or "repair." The usage in Revelation (Greek) adds the nuance of a song which is "fresh." What are the ways music renews you? Repairs you? Gives you a fresh outlook? Lifts your spirit?

When we sing our own new songs they will **emulate** the God-relationship people experienced in the God Story.

The new song originates in the **heart**. It can be inspired by many things. But it is OUR OWN new song. And that is what all of the Psalms are trying to get us to understand.

When I feel inspired to write a song, chorus, poem, or thought - several things happen.

- My heart begins to stir
- My God-thoughts begin to clarify
- Gratefulness wells in my heart
- I express my feelings in praise to my King!

What do each of these passages teach us about the nature of our own new songs?

Ephesians 5:19 Colossians 3:16 Psalm 95:2

It will be amazing to stand before God and fully understand the power of music - both for good and for evil. Either way it is a huge influence of the message of humanity.

So when you feel your heart beginning to sing, go with it!
