

## **SEEDS & SOWING**

Here are some awesome verses that trace the idea of seed and sowing throughout the God Story. Enjoy!

Genesis 1.11,12 Then God said, "Let the earth sprout vegetation, plants yielding seed, and fruit trees on the earth bearing fruit after their kind with seed in them"; and it was so. The earth brought forth vegetation, plants yielding seed after their kind, and trees bearing fruit with seed in them, after their kind; and God saw that it was good." What do these two verses say about God as a grower?

Deuteronomy 22.9 "You shall not sow your vineyard with two kinds of seed, or all the produce of the seed which you have sown and the increase of the vineyard will become defiled. What is the Law trying to explain about producing crops?

Psalms 97.11 "Light is sown like seed for the righteous, and gladness for the upright in heart." What does this mean?

Psalms 126.6 "He who goes to and fro weeping, carrying his bag of seed, shall indeed come again with a shout of joy, bringing his sheaves with him." Why is seed-sowing so important to God?

Ecclesiastes 11.6 "Sow your seed in the morning and do not be idle in the evening, for you do not know whether morning or evening sowing will succeed, or whether both of them alike will be good." Why is being industrious important to one who plants?

Zechariah 8.12 'For there will be peace for the seed: the vine will yield its fruit, the land will yield its produce and the heavens will give their dew; and I will cause the remnant of this people to inherit all these things." What does "peace for the seed" mean?

Matthew 17.20 And He said to them, "Because of the littleness of your faith; for truly I say to you, if you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible to you." *Mustard seeds are small - but what huge service do the mustard plants accomplish?* 

2Corinthians 9.10 "Now He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness..." What is our harvest?

Galatians 3.16 "Now the promises were spoken to Abraham and to his seed. He does not say, "And to seeds," as referring to many, but rather to one, "And to your seed," that is, Christ." What is the difference, seed or seed(s)?

James 3.18 "And the seed whose fruit is righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace." What does this have to do with how we live?

1 Peter 1.23 "for you have been born again not of seed which is perishable but imperishable, that is, through the living and enduring word of God." *How can any seed be imperishable?* 

1 John 3.9 "No one who is born of God practices sin, because His seed abides in him; and he cannot sin, because he is born of God." What does this tell us about supernatural power?
