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#### YOUR DAY BY DAY QUESTIONS AS YOU GO DEEPER!

These questions can serve several uses as you gear up to grow spiritual life within your friends and family, and follow the 40 "days" of the Streamsbook!

**#1** - it can be an asset to you **personally** as you read the Streamsbook, a harmony of the four gospels focusing on the story of God's Son. These questions will help you as you read, highlighting concepts and issues that will quickly help you to move deeply into an understanding of this remarkable life.

**#2** - it can be used as a **discussion guide** for you and a few friends, those who may be interested in discovering their own non-religious opinions about God's Son Jesus.

**#3** - it can be used as a **leader's guide** for your preparation to help others discover their own spirituality.

Formulate your OWN questions as you move deeper into an understanding of each teaching or event.

Who is Jesus and what does He bring to us?



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#### OLDER THAN TIME John 1:1-5

What beginning do you think is being spoken about here? Why is this mind blowing? How do life, light, and darkness connect? Do you believe in good and evil, and to what extent? What if it is true that God's Son (Jesus) did indeed create the world?

#### GOD CAME NEAR Luke 1:5-66

Why was Luke so interested in being "precise?" (his gospel is the most chronological) Do you believe that there are angels that have access to multiple dimensions? What makes Mary's response to the angel Gabriel so remarkable? Who is Gabriel? Why do you think that Zacharias' family was probably watched closely in the upcoming days?

What is the most remarkable thing you see in these two passages? It is hard to find the Living God in a crazy-busy world. How do you feel about your "God comprehension?"



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#### THE LIGHT AND THE LIFE John 1:6-18

John "the baptist" was the son of Zacharias and Elizabeth. What was his family relationship to Jesus? Why did John the Baptist and John the Apostle see Jesus as the "Light?" When John says that "the Word became flesh," what do you think he means?

#### THE KING IS BORN

#### Luke 2:1-40

Here you will find the traditional "Christmas Story." *What strikes you as you read it*? Why are the words of Simeon and Anna so significant? Why do you think that Jesus (Yeshua) needed to be born a Jew?

In what ways do I feel the presence of "light" in my life?? If you were God and were going to unfold a story in the fabric of time, how would you have done it?



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#### THE BOY KING Luke 2:41-52

Why do you think that Jesus' childhood was a remarkable one? What things did He appear to understand at only 12 years of age? Why do you think that it was important for Jesus to "continue in subjection" to His earthly parents?

In what ways does your life reflect an interest in your "Father's business?"

#### THE LIGHT, THE LIFE, THE LAMB

#### **JOHN** 1:19-51

Why do you think that the Jews were interested in the prophetic identity of John the Baptist? What does John reveal about his mission and his identity (he is a different man than John the apostle)? What was the result of John the Baptist's words?

In what ways does the picture of Jesus being a sacrificial Lamb touch my life? In what ways do I find Christ increasing and myself decreasing as my journey unfolds?



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#### TOUGH CHOICES Luke 4:1-13

What was Satan's strategy for tempting Jesus? How was Satan using or misusing God's Word when tempting Jesus? What would have happened if Satan had been successful in shipwrecking Jesus' mission?

What have you learned about being succeptable to temptation?

#### WHO WILL FOLLOW? John 2:1-3:21

What does the wedding at Cana teach us about Jesus' relationships?

This is the first of only 30 or so recorded individual miracles of the probable thousands He performed. We have about 35 days of Jesus' 3 year public ministry recorded for us in the Gospels!

Why was the encounter with Nicodemus so unique? So significant? What is Jesus saying about the formation of spiritual life within a human soul?

How do I hold up under tough spiritual circumstances? When it comes to Jesus' miracles I find myself...



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#### **NOW IT BEGINS** Luke 4:14-30

What kinds of questions would people from Jesus' hometown have that other people might not ask? What were the things Jesus' neighbors liked to hear from Him? What was the meaning of His statement about parables being quoted to Him in the future? What were the things that enraged them, and why were they so upset?

If this Isaiah prophecy is true, how does it make you feel? (Isaiah 61)

#### THE SUCCESSFUL HEALER Matthew 4;23-25

How would Jesus have been able to get time alone with His Father? What kind of impact do you think these miracles produced in the lives of the recipients of God's power?



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#### THE WOMAN AT THE WELL John 4:1-45

Why were the disciples surprised that Jesus was having this conversation? Why do you think there were "no dealings" with Samaritans?

What is at the core of what this woman values? What within this encounter blew this woman away? What was her station in life?

When Jesus said the "fields were white" what do you think He was talking about? What things did Jesus expect His followers to learn from this situation? What do we learn about Jesus as a teacher from observing this encounter?

Do I believe there is a "living water" and if there is, how is it delivered? What is the "food of my soul" that captures my imagination?



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#### HEART TEACHINGS #1 Matthew 5:1-48

If the "poor" are "spiritual beggars" how does this effect our understanding of the progression of these first verses? Why the examples of salt and light? What is the difference between what "has been said" and what is clarified by Jesus? What are the subjects that Jesus restates? What is difficult about what Jesus is saying here?

How do I feel about "being holy" like my Heavenly Father is holy?

Is the holiness mentioned here emerging from my own adequacy or from God's?



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#### HEART TEACHINGS #2 Matthew 6:1-34

According to Jesus, what are the evidences of a hypocritical spiritual life? How do we place His kingdom first when there are so many distractions to our hearts? Was Jesus giving us a specific prayer to repeat, a prayer formula, or describing a heart relationship? How can a person identify and differentiate treasures in heaven and treasures on earth? Worrying or being anxious seem to consume spiritual living. What things cause people to worry?

What causes worry or anxiety in my life? How would I describe my prayer experiences? What are the enemies of prayer in my life, and how can I contain them?



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#### HEART TEACHINGS #3 Matthew 7:1-27

Why does Jesus view judging others as a chief spiritual flaw? Why is hypocrisy so high on Jesus' list of things that kill spiritual life? How much does God want His kingdom to grow in us and around us?

How easy is it to find spiritual life? Why is the "golden rule" the "heart of the prophets?"

How easy is it to enter the Kingdom of Heaven? What is the key to building a life upon rock rather than sand? What was different about Jesus as the people listened to Him teach?

What evidences of true spirituality exist in my life?



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#### MIRACLES Luke 4:31-34

What do you learn about demons from these encounters? How did people respond to what they were seeing? What appears to be the focus of the miracles that Jesus performed? How many miracles does it appear He engaged in? Where did Jesus often do His preaching?

#### FAITH ENCOUNTER Matthew 8:1-13

Why did He send this leper back to the religious leaders? Where is Capernaum? What were the "centurion's" observations and why did Jesus see them as so remarkable? (a centurion was a commander of 100 soldiers in the Roman empire's occupying army - he was not a Jew).

What is my personal take on the existence of demons then and today - and what are the implications of this?

# DAY ELEVEN

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#### 38 LONG YEARS John 5:1-17

Try to imagine the depths of emotions within this encounter. What would this man's life have looked like? Do you think that people were really healed in this pool of water? Why were the religious leaders so distressed by Jesus healing on the Sabbath, and how could they have had such hard hearts over what had occurred? What did sinning have to with this man's healing?

#### JESUS WHO? John 5:18-47

What was the root issue of why the religious leaders could not accept Jesus or recognize His works? What does honoring God have to do with finding eternal life? Where did Jesus appeal for His authority and why? Why was Jesus so hard on the religious leaders (who sat in the seat of Moses)?

Do I believe these where actual events or just hopeful stories by all who were seeing and experiencing them?

#### WORKS OF THE WORD Mark 1:29-2:12



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How did Jesus find time to be alone and to pray? Why do you think He stayed in populated areas? What practical issues did Jesus' popularity produce? Why are these "roof friends" so unique? What do miracles have to do with forgiving sins? Which is easier, healing a paralytic or forgiving his sins? How did people respond to this miracle? (this helps explain why people were coming from everywhere!)

How do I find "alone time" with God? How do I feel about having my sins forgiven?



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#### THE BREAD OF LIFE John 6:1-71

Why is the feeding of the 5000 so remarkable? What part do His followers play in this drama? What does the storm have to do with feeding all the people? What is the work of God? How can this be "a work?" Where have the Jews experienced bread coming down out of heaven before? How can someone come out of heaven and at the same time be from Nazareth? How does a person enter into the Kingdom of Heaven? Can you see how this whole section of unfolding events unify around the teaching of "bread?"

How have I embraced the reality of God "coming near" in my life, and in what ways is it "difficult" for me?



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#### **THE READY HEART** Luke 12:1-39

What is leaven? Why does Jesus use bread as an analogy so often? Whose authority are we to ultimately revere and fear? What kinds of fear are we being prepared to rebuff? Why does the man ask Jesus for His part of the inheritance, and why does Jesus go another direction to address this request? Why would a person consider his or her soul a treasure? What is Jesus' answer to Peter's question? How does Jesus' statement about "raining fire" stack up to your picture of what you want in a Savior? What was Jesus' baptism that was yet to happen?

In what ways do I live as though my life - and my future life - are a treasure?

### DAY FIFTEEN

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#### HARD TIMES AHEAD Matthew 9:1-10:23

Which is easier - really? Why were the Pharisees offended by Jesus' choice of Matthew? Were the Pharisees and religious leaders healthy or sick? Why were His chosen people so unshepherded? What are we to pray for? What guidelines did Jesus give as His followers went out? To what extent can we rely upon God when we get in a tough spot?

In what ways do I feel shepherded? Not shepherded? Am I more likely to respond in faith or non-faith when I get into tough situations?



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#### TRAVELING COMPANIONS Matthew 10:24-42

Is there anything in this passage that offends your sensibilities? Who are we to fear? What do we learn about the value of His followers?

#### **SEED & SOILS**

Mark 4:1-4:34

Why is the parable of the sower key to understanding the Kingdom? How deep and far should a Christ-follower's devotion run? What do learn about soils and spiritual life? Why would the Kingdom come from the smallest seed?

I am confident in my walk with Jesus because ...

#### CHAINS IN LIFE & DEATH Mark 4:35-5:43

### DAY SEVENTEEN

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Try to recreate this storm story in your mind. What thoughts would have been in His follower's minds? How did this possessed man recognize Jesus? Why didn't Jesus ask him to come with him once he had been delivered? What was happening inside of Jairus when he came to Jesus? Considering his position, what would have been the risk for this man? Why was this woman with "an issue of blood" so desperate? What adds to the drama?

Think about the series of miracles which occur in this section. As you recount each one, try to imagine the weight of freedom as each one unfolded. What is really cool here is that the miracles are woven together, and multiple miracles mean multiple interactions between the recipients. The disciples must have been blown away!

In what ways do I feel God has intervened in my life in supernatural ways? (be specific)



#### DEBT & DEBTORS Luke 7:36-50

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Why was this Pharisee so offended by the woman who anointed Jesus' feet with perfume? What do you think was going through this woman's mind? How did Jesus address Simon the Pharisee's thoughts (his face must have betrayed him!?)? How direct is Jesus as He addresses this conflict? What man would have authority to forgive sins? Why is the authority to forgive sins important?

I can identify with this weeping woman in the following ways:

#### WATER WALK Matthew 14:22-15:21

appear to be a set up?

In what ways does this appear to be a set up? Why did they think that Jesus was a ghost? Why would Peter have done something so crazy? What caused Peter's faith to fail?

#### DECISION TIME Mark 7:1-8:37

Why did the Pharisees struggle so much with setting aside their traditions? What is it that makes men and women impure - food or issues of the heart? What does the woman from Tyre reveal that so impresses Jesus?

How do I feel about getting out of the boat and meeting Jesus on the waves? Is this where my life appears to be headed?

# day twenty 2

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#### FEEDING THE 4000 Mark 8:1-38

What motivated this miracle from a practical perspective? What do you think Jesus' goal for His followers was in this situation?

(Note that Jesus and His followers often got into boats and travelled down the shore or across to the other side. The Sea of Galilee opened the opportunity for mobility, and for many people to access Christ.)

There is obviously something deeper to be understood about the loaves and how they were multiplied. What are they supposed to be understanding?

This blind man's healing is the only "two-step" miracle. What are the possible reasons for such a two-part process? Jesus begins to press His followers about His identity. It is time for them to put together what they are seeing with what they know from the scriptures. What is their conclusion and why is this significant? How do you think Peter felt after he was rebuked by His Master?

In what ways do I feel I am being fed by God? In what ways am I refusing to eat?



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#### **UP IN THE AIR** Matthew 15:22-17:15

Are you getting a sense that the volume of people who were healed over these 3-4 years was amazing? Why was it important for Elijah and Moses to arrive to be with Jesus? What do you think it means to be "transfigured?" What do you think it looked like? Who was Elijah (the prophet) and why was John the Baptist the returning Elijah? (see 2 Kings/Malachi 4)

#### COME TO ME Matthew 11:20-30

Why were these cities blessed to experience the miracles that were flowing from the Son of God? Why the comparison to cities like Sodom and Gomorrah? What is the significance of Jesus' prayer?

In what ways do I feel I have entered into the rest of my Master? What do I think is easy about His yoke in my life?

### DAY TWENTY-TWO 22

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#### LIVING WATER John 7:1-23

What would it have been like to be the human brothers of the Son of God? In what ways does this look like a set up? What was it that blew the people in Jerusalem away concerning Jesus? Why was it necessary for the Jews to avoid outward appearance and see more deeply? Why does Jesus make this claim about living water at this place and at this time?

People were sharply divided over Jesus. Where they came down on Him would have massive implications for their souls!

In what ways do I sense there is living water flowing out of my soul? In what ways am I still stuck on outward appearances?

## DAY TWENTY-THREE 23

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#### GOD IS INVOLVED Luke 10:1-11:13

Why do you think they were sent out in pairs? Why the harsh response to cities that would not receive them? Why the odd response to the returning twosomes? How do you think His followers felt after hearing Jesus' words?

Why is the statement "who is my neighbor?" so telling? How do you feel when you read the story of the "good samaritan?"

Why was Jesus, Mary, and Martha's relationship so special (see John 11)? What is the most up-front lesson from Mary and Martha's encounter with Jesus? Why is the parable about the friend such an odd way to teach about prayer?

How would you have felt about being a part of Jesus' friendship circle?



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#### WORTHLESS WOMAN John 8:1-38

Jesus is in the middle of a teaching moment when the adulterous woman is brought in. What were the apparent motives for this confrontation?

Why did Jesus write on the ground? What do you think He was writing in the dirt?

What does Jesus expect after He releases this woman?

Why was Jesus so emphatic about His witness to and from the Father? Why would He be "lifted up?"

#### **CONFLICT WITH THE KING** John 8:39-59

The Jews were quite proud of their connection with Moses and Abraham. Why was this? Why is Jesus so hard on the religious leaders of Israel? Jesus' criticisms were not lost on the Pharisees - and they were free with their insults for Him. How do they insult Him in this passage?

What is my sense for Jesus' level of compassion? Do I feel you experience this in your spiritual journey?



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#### FACTS ARE FACTS John 9:1-33

What would it have been like to live from birth as a blind man? Why would the disciples have such a twisted perspective on blindness? Why did Jesus use clay for this miracle? What is disturbing about the Pharisees' questioning of the healed man? Why did they drag in his parents?

Why do you think the Pharisees decided to insult this man, and why do you think he was so emboldened? What was the final outcome for the blind man? Notice Jesus' parting shot.

In what ways have I ever experienced personal spiritual blindness?

### DAY TWENTY-SIX $\boldsymbol{7}$

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#### SIGNS & TROUBLES Luke 11:14-54

Why did the Jews demand a sign from Jesus? How much can we place our hope in self-reformation? Why did Jesus de-emphasize the woman's comment about His mother? Why didn't Jesus participate in the Jewish ceremonial washings? What marks of hypocrisy does Jesus define here? Why were they trying to catch Him in His words?

How do I observe light flowing in and through my life?



LOST & FOUND Luke 14:25-16:31 page 67 in the Streamsbook

Jesus makes this "following" statement many times. Each group who follows gets the opportunity to take it to the next level. List the things that describe this next level:

Why does Jesus use this parable to demonstrate this next level? Why did the Pharisees react so often to the people Jesus was hanging with?

Now two more parables are given: the lost coin and the lost son. How does each amplify this next level? What instruction does the parable of the debts and debtors add to this teaching, and what do we learn about the Pharisees and their values?

How does the parable of Lazarus and the rich man complete this series of teachings?

How does my life reflect "next level" living?



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### THE GOOD SHEPHERD John 10:1-42

Jesus takes the time to explain this shepherding analogy to His disciples. Why is it appropriate? Why is Jesus the Door of the sheep, and what does this mean?

Why aren't there many ways to God, and why don't all zealous roads lead to Him?

Why is it important that Jesus define where His authority comes from?

Jesus quotes Psalm 69 and once again confounds the reasonings of the religious leaders. What was the difference between the Law and their Law?

Jesus spent most of His time in remote areas away from Jerusalem. What would be the practical reasons for this?

How does my life seem to be responsive to the Good Shepherd?

### DAY TWENTY-NINE

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#### RAISING LAZARUS John 11:1-42

This Lazarus is the brother of Mary and Martha, followers of Jesus. It gives us additional insight into the follower community of relationships that would later provide eyewitness propulsion for the Good News. Can you imagine the corroborating stories these three could tell!?

What insight does Jesus seem to have on this situation? Why did the disciples think that they might die by going along (where is Bethany)? How many people did Jesus raise from the dead in the Gospels? What kind of hardness of heart would cause you to head for the Pharisees? What was the chief concern of the religious leaders regarding Lazarus? Why did Jesus have to be careful about being out in public?

How convinced am I that I am going to be raised from the dead?



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#### **PARABLES OF THE KINGDOM** Matthew 21:1 - 22:22

The donkey or colt is the conveyance of royalty. Did it happen just as Jesus said? What prophecy is being referred to here? Read Psalm 118 for some further insight into this passage (the Cornerstone).

Why did people cut palm branches and spread them out as Jesus came into the city? This is Jesus second cleansing of the Temple. He immediately begins to heal the sick in the Temple. Why is this different than what has happened before, and how do the religious leaders respond?

Jesus now gives several parables to explain spirituality to the people - as well as the religious leaders. List the parables and think through why He choose these parables to tell at this point in His ministry? (the two sons, the landowner, the wedding party) What is the trap being set with the question over paying taxes to Ceasar?

In what ways am I a person who follows through spiritually in my relationship with Jesus?



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#### THE TRAP IS SET Matthew 22:23-24:22

What was the key mistake that the religious leaders continued to make? What shut down further questioning by the leaders and why? Review Jesus' evaluation of the scribes and Pharisees - what formed the basis of their hypocrisy? What do we know for sure will occur at the end of the age? (make a list!) Why did Jesus spend so much time on the Mount of Olives?

Why would Jesus tell me everything that would happen in the future? Why did Jesus feel such sorrow and pain over Jerusalem?

# DAY THIRTY-TWO 22

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#### **BE READY** Matthew 24:23-25:46

What does the fig tree teach us about the end of the age? How does this ending compare with what is explained in Joel 3 and Acts 2? What do we learn from the inclusion of Noah in this teaching? The ten virgins reveal teaching about readiness. What does readiness have to do with our spiritual life? Does the parable of the talents seem harsh to you? How do the things we do in our lives relate to the final judgement? How does our relationship with people impact our relationship with God?

In what ways do I feel I am able to live an alert and prepared life?



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#### THE TIME IS HERE Matthew 26:1-5

This passage marks a pivot toward the unfolding of the end of Christ's time here on earth. Why did the chief priests and elders need to use stealth to kill Christ?

#### ANOINTING THE LIGHT John 12:1-50

This expensive anointing had taken place before. What are the differences and the similarities? Why was Judas so offended, and why did Jesus permit this extravagance? How was the earlier raising of Lazarus from the dead impacting the multitudes? Can you imagine the hardness of heart it would take to want to kill Lazarus as well? What impact was occurring among the religious leaders?

In what ways have I displayed extravagant love toward my Creator and Savior?



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#### TIME ALONE WITH GOD John 13:1-38

How do you think that Jesus knew His time had come? Why in world would a King wash the feet of His subjects? What made a disciple clean or not clean? If it was inevitable, why was Jesus so troubled that Judas was going to betray Him? Had Jesus confided in any one else concerning Judas? How will others know about Christ's continued presence in their lives? How do you think Peter felt about this news?

What are some ways I can wash the feet of the people around me?

# DAY THIRTY-FIVE 35

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#### THE TRUE VINE John 14:1-16:11

Why is a vision for our future home important for our spiritual lives? Why were Thomas and Phillip struggling and how did it make Jesus feel? What is the Spirit supposed to do for Jesus' followers? How do we demonstrate love for Christ? What do you learn about spiritual nourishment from the teaching of the vine and the branches? What was Jesus ongoing plan for the followers He had chosen? What was the practical benefit for His followers now that He was leaving?

How do I sense God's nourishment in my life? How do I sense the presence of the Holy Spirit in my life?



#### **SPIRIT OF TRUTH** John 16:12-17:19

What is the main help that the Holy Spirit gives His followers? What do His followers seem to be struggling with? How does Jesus describe His process and purpose? How does Jesus transition from talking to His followers to speaking with His Father? What is "Jesus' joy?" Who is Jesus praying for? What is His desire for us?

Do I feel I have defined purpose for my life?

DAY THIRTY-SEVEN 2'

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#### WHO IS THE GREATEST? Luke 22:24-53

Why would His followers be interested in who was greatest at this point in Jesus' ministry? What makes a person great in the Kingdom of heaven? What was their destiny? What does the "wheat" comment teach us about spiritual warfare?

Why does Jesus change the ground rules for being "sent?" What were the signs of Jesus' distress in the garden? How did anyone else know that He was being strengthened by an angel? How do you think He felt when He found His followers sleeping?

In what ways do I feel secure in God's hands?



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#### KILLING CHRIST John 18:12-19:42

What is particularly remarkable when they come to take Jesus? What was the purpose of Peter's "ear carving?" Why would Peter deny being one of Christ's followers? Why would he have been standing at the door in such a dangerous situation?

Why was it necessary to be taken before the Romans? Why was Pilate filled with such consternation? What was the purpose of His whipping? Why were the Jews so rabid for His blood? Why did the inscription over Christ goad the Jews? What are the striking or odd things that happen here?

How emotionally involved am I with this part of the God-Story?

# DAY THIRTY-NINE 30

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#### FACT OR FICTION? LUKE 24:1-53

Who do you think the two men were outside of the tomb of Jesus? Why was Jesus unrecognizable to His followers? What would have caused their eyes to open when they saw Him break bread? Why would Jesus have eaten a fish? What were they supposed to wait for?



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#### FEED MY SHEEP John 20;19-21;25

Why were His followers shut up in the house? Why is Thomas' encounter so moving? Why would they have returned to fishing? How would Peter have felt being questioned by Jesus?

How convinced am I about this account of Jesus being raised from the dead?

# My Story

Together we have read about this truly miraculous life. You have examined firsthand who Jesus claimed to be and what many eye witnesses said He did.
